Clubs

We are pleased to be able to provide a wide range of clubs at Watermoor.

As with many other schools, our teachers volunteer their own time to deliver clubs at



lunchtime or after-school. We limit numbers for some clubs to ensure that ratios are in line with health and safety guidelines; there are clubs with unlimited spaces so that your child doesn't miss out. We change the clubs on offer three times per year to ensure that a wide range of activities are provided across the age ranges and in response to attendance at each club. We also hire out our facilities to a range of local club providers which your children can access on-site after school or at weekends.

Mr Rosser is in charge of organising our sporting events; children take part in events such as football and rugby tournaments, the swimming gala and gymnastics. We normally ask the



children if they would like to take part, then send out forms to those indicated 'yes', as it's important that engagement and attendance remains high ahead of a scheduled event.
